9. CORPORATE SERVICES REPORTS

9.1 Monthly Financial Report for Period Ending 31 March 2013

The Monthly Financial Report has been prepared for the period ending 31 March 2013.

The following is a summary of major variances and points to note.

Income Statement:

As at 31 March 2013, 75% of the financial year has elapsed, the Income Statement now indicates a slight surplus of \$32,123 in the *Net Operating Surplus*, This will be further bolstered by the fact that there is still approximately \$2.4 million in reimbursable works to be claimed through the Road Maintenance Performance Contract and Flood Damage restoration works.

Claims submitted through the Queensland Reconstruction Authority ("QRA") for reimbursement in flood damage restoration works have required further clarification from Council and this has slowed the process, mainly Council OnCost rates in payroll, creditors and stores. Council engineers and appointed consultants are working with QRA staff to ensure future claims are submitted in compliance and paid promptly.

The \$2.3 million shortfall in grants and subsidies due to upfront payment in 2011/12 for the Financial Assistance Grant (FAG) will be adjusted in the revised budget to reflect actual amount to be received in the 2012/13 Financial Year.

General Notes:

Council's audited financial statements for the 2011/2012 Financial Year have been finalised by Moore Stephens (QAO appointed auditors) and currently being assessed by QAO. The Adoption of the Annual Report has been tentatively included as a separate report on the basis that they are received from QAO in time for the meeting.

An amended budget has been prepared and will be workshopped with Councillors following the April meeting. While there are no major changes to the total operational expenditure, there are a number of proposed changes to the capital program.

6. DIRECTOR OF ENGINEERING ROADS REPORTS

6.1 Works Report

Plant Hire Tenders for Water Trucks, Graders and Low Loaders have been received and assessed for conformance and are presented to Council for consideration and approval.

Additional information has been sought from two of the nonconforming tenderers for the supply and delivery of gravel for Department of Transport and Main Roads' Flood Damage Rectification Works. This additional information is being assessed. A late submission has also been received from Hawkins Transport.

Design work is continuing on the Normanton Airport Carpark and Karumba Point (Palmer Street) Boat Ramp projects. An update of these projects is presented for Council's information.

An opportunity to bitumen seal additional sections of the Normanton-Burketown Road has been identified and is presented for Council's consideration.

Additional research has been conducted into the comparative effects of AAB Quads and A-Triple configurations on road infrastructure. Although the effects of the two configurations are different, their overall effect on road pavements appears to be similar.

Budget areas for ongoing maintenance and construction works are performing generally within their specified variance range.

7.2 Water Status Report for March 2013

During, March 2013, 71.3 ML of water was pumped from Glenore Weir. Bore water pumped was a total of 2.6 ML. Total water received at the water treatment plant was 63.9 ML. This was more than last month.

Glenore Weir level on 31 March 2013 was 2.15AHD, the level of the weir on 28 February 2013 was 2.04 AHD.

Consumption for Normanton was 1.86 kL/day per connection and Consumption for Karumba was 2.46 kL /day per connection.

A total of 10 tests were conducted on water samples from the reticulation system for E-Coli during the month of March 2013. No E-coli was detected.
